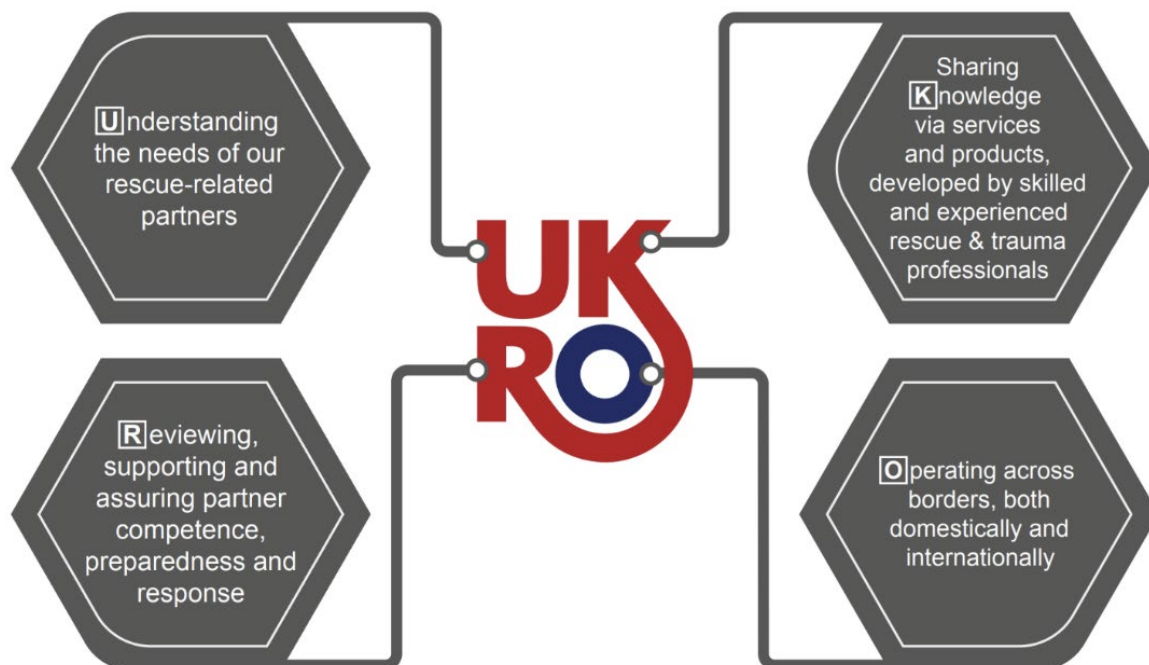
The United Kingdom Rescue Organisation

ISO – International Organisation for Standards
